## Student Activities: A Year In Review

As Ms. Bacigalupi alluded to in last week's letter, we are in the home stretch of this school year. Spring is very busy - a time when we celebrate all we've accomplished and completed this year, while also already preparing for next school year. Here at Holy Trinity, we're fortunate to have the student interest, as well as parent and teacher leadership to offer a variety of student activities that truly support and challenge our students outside the classroom. 2023-2024 was an amazing year in terms
of accomplishments for our student activity participants!

- By the end of this month, 299 students will have been involved in and performed five different musicals through our Eyrie Musical Theatre program for $\mathrm{K}-8$ students.
- 52 students participated in 4th through 8th Grade Quick Recall teams this year, during which we brought home the CSAL (Catholic Schools Academic League) Archdiocese Championship trophies in both the 7th \& 8th grade league, as well as the 4 th \& 5th grade league.
- An amazing first in the Archdiocese - all three teams (max \# of teams allowed) competing in the $4 / 5$ league advanced to the Academic Final 4. Two of our three teams remained undefeated all season long until the Championship game, earning them Regular-Season Champion trophies, too.
- 24 Students qualified to participate in KAAC (Kentucky Association for Academic Competition) 6th Grade Showcase and Governor's Cup events.
- Our Quick Recall team in the middle school division won District and Regional Championships, advancing them to State competition for the first time in more than 15 years!
- Three students earned a combined six individual medals at the 6th Grade Showcase in Essay Writing, Language Arts, Social Studies, and Arts \& Humanities.
- Seven students individually earned 19 different medals between District and Regional middle-school competitions in Arts \& Humanities, Language Arts, Math, Science, Social Studies, and Essay Writing to advance them to the State competition this year, as well.
- In May, 10 of our students will compete in the annual Book Bee competition.
- 70 Student Council members from grades 6 through 8 at both campuses have participated in, planned, and led over 30 different activities this year, including Catholic Schools Week, Pet Blessing, Holiday Readers, Recycling program, Derby activities, Rice Bowl, WaterStep shoe drive, School Supply Drive, New Student Orientation, among others.
- 23 middle school students participated in Y Club, specifically their KYA and KUNA mockgovernment conferences. At KYA, our delegation had bills signed into law, and then forwarded to actual Kentucky elected leaders, while at KUNA, one of our resolutions was passed by students and affirmed by the Secretary-General. At both conferences, HT was named a Premiere Delegation and individual students brought home awards for Oustanding Delegate and Outstanding Speaker.
- 65 girls in K-6 from both campuses participated in Girl Scouts this year.
- Finally, our PEP classes (Pupil Enrichment Program) allowed 810 students to be involved in fun after-school extra-curricular activities between our Fall, Holiday, Winter, and Spring sessions.

Applications are out for next school year's middle school activities already. Last week after Mass, middle school leaders spoke to all current 5th through 7th graders on both campuses to encourage them to apply for Quick Recall, Student Council, and/or Y Club (includingKYA \& KUNA). These applications are due this Friday, April 19, by 12 noon, so that we can hold our Leadership Board elections in May and plan summer and back-to-school activities before the last day of school. Information has also been shared on myHTPS parent and student homeroom pages, as well as later in this newsletter, too. (Know that Quick Recall applications for grades 4-5 next year will be released in November, along with Book Bee applications, as their season is later than the middle school season.)

Wondering what these opportunities could mean for your middle school child and if you should get them involved? Bring your questions to our Parent Information Night for Student Activities this Wednesday, April 17 in the Cafeteria from 7-8 pm (during Youth Group), which will also be offered online. You will hear from parents who have children involved in the activities and learn why they're so passionate about getting more students and families involved.

Thank you to all of our parent and teacher coaches and advisors who share their time to make all of these amazing opportunities possible for our students! I'm excited to see what next year brings.

## Seeking Girls on the Run Coaches



We'd love to restart our Girls on the Run, https://www.gotrkentuckiana.orgL, program here at HT! Girls on the Run uses running and other physical activities as a platform for teaching life skills and promoting holistic health outcomes for girls of all abilities.

The curriculum includes lessons relevant for 3 rd to 5th and 6th to 8th grade girls. Prior to the start of the program, volunteer coaches participate in extensive coach training which prepares them to build relationships with girls, create a positive, inclusive environment, and support individual improvement.

Coaches also receive resources and training to ensure an inclusive experience for girls with physical, cognitive, and sensory disabilities. The program is delivered to small groups of approximately 16 girls twice per week for 10 weeks. Lessons are 90 minutes in length and specifically target helping girls improve in competence, confidence, caring, character, connection, and contribution, in addition to teaching critical life skills such as how to manage emotions, help others, make intentional decisions, and resolve conflict. At the end of the program, all Girls on the Run school teams from across the area come together for a celebratory 5 K event held in the Kentuckiana area. Completing a 5 K gives the girls a tangible sense of achievement as well as a framework for setting and achieving life goals.
