When Fr. Shayne arrived at Holy Trinity, he challenged us all to live out the ideas of Pray. Study. Serve. Through our service learning program, our students, teachers, and families have the opportunity to learn about the various needs in our community and donate and/or get involved in a variety of ways.

Guided by the <u>Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy</u>, every grade level and campus has a community partner for which we do service every other month. During the

months in between, our student groups host their service projects for the whole school to be involved, if families choose to do so (think Rice Bowl, Waterstep shoe drives, KYA and KUNA service projects, end-of-year used school supply donations, marker and crayon recycling, etc.). The goal is that by the time students reach Jr. High and are preparing for Confirmation - and ultimately head on to high school where service hours are required annually to graduate, our students have already participated in acts of service addressing a variety of needs in our community and with a variety of outreach partners. In sharing a list of possible community partners that welcome youth volunteers, I tell students, "If you don't like the service you're doing, you haven't found the right service partner or activity yet." I also share Muhammad Ali's reminder that "Service to others is the rent you pay for your room here on Earth."

This month's Fruit of the Holy Spirit our community is focused on is Peace, which coincides with our final Service Learning drive for our grade-level community partners. Whether we see it or not, when we serve and share with others, we bring peace to others. We brought peace through our donation of a combined 6,200 items to 12 different community organizations during our Thanksgiving and Catholic Schools Week drives, when our 8th graders repaired six separate homes and a food pantry during their week-long service trip in Appalachia, and during our 7th graders' Fall Service Day at St. Vincent DePaul Louisville, Schuhmann Center, Golden Arrow, and Catholic Charities.

This week, to support our school's service efforts, our Parish Outreach group is making a \$500 donation to each of our grade-level non-profit partners: Nazareth Home Clifton, Animal Care Society, Schuhmann Center, Sister Visitor Center, Fr. Jack Jones Food Pantry, Golden Arrow, Catholic Charities Migration and Refugee Services, Dare to Care, and St. Vincent DePaul Louisville, as well as a \$100 donation to our Parish Seniors Group. Tomorrow at Mass, we've invited representatives from the organizations, as well as our service learning coordinators, to be recognized for their continued contributions to our local community. Please join us, if you'd like, to celebrate all of those who make our service work possible!

Finally, thank you! Thank you to all who have contributed their time, talent, and/or treasure to our service-learning projects and drives! We greatly appreciate your support in helping your child shop, volunteering your time during classroom projects to create requested donations, chaperoning service field trips, and delivering drive donations.
