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As your school counselors, we dedicate our work to Holy Trinity's vision of supporting the whole child by caring for our students' academic, social, emotional, and spiritual well-being. Through Christ, our job is to guide and nurture those entering our buildings each day. Our work focuses on teaching and reinforcing essential skills like self-awareness, self-management, relationship building, social awareness, and responsible decision-making, allowing every child to thrive in and out of the classroom.

Our primary role is multifaceted and some of the key components include:

- Social and emotional support through short-term and brief individual counseling, group sessions, and classroom guidance lessons
- Program development and implementation of Archdiocese curriculums including Friendly, Speak Up Be Safe, and Signs of Suicide
- Collaboration and consultation with teachers, administrators, and families
- Resource liaison to community mental health services and organizations
- Participation in Archdiocesan and school crisis response team planning and practices
- Advocates of inclusivity, diversity, and equity within the school environment

Our overarching goal with these responsibilities is to create a culture of respect, empathy, and understanding. We are already planning how to expand on these facets next year, and with the addition of a second counselor at the St. Matthews campus, we look forward to further promoting an environment that enables every student to reach their full potential!

While each counselor may assist different areas of our student population, we see ourselves as one team working to provide Holy Trinity with the best possible social-emotional resources for all of our families.

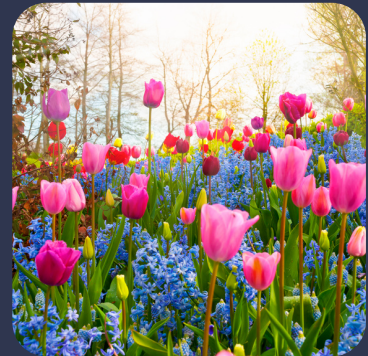
March Madness Spirit Day

What a week HT had last week!

Governor's Cup State tournament included 5 students competing in 6 different areas individually: 8th graders Grayson S, Jack R, Jacob B, Maggie H, and Max W. Grayson S, Jack R, and Jacob B were also joined by 8th graders William B, Andrew C, and Daniel W, and 7th graders Bob E and Benjamin T to compete in 4 rounds of Quick Recall Pool Play at the State tournament.

Our Grades 6 - 7 - 8 KUNA (Kentucky United Nations Assembly) delegation participated in their annual conference, representing South Africa and Japan. They were recognized as a Premiere Delegation and brought home the Outstanding Country Representation Award (awarded to 1 school per conference). They also had their resolution presented by Japanese ambassadors passed in Voting Committees. 6th grader Brinn S was named an Outstanding Speaker, while 8th grader Elliot R was recognized as an Outstanding Ambassador.



4th & 5th Grade Quick Recall Teams all advanced to the Archdiocese Final 4! In the Championship Match, Green played White with Green winning in overtime. Our Green and White teams both remained undefeated all season long, earning them regular-season champion trophies, too. Our blue team, who competed in the Final 4, had just 1 loss for the season. On Wednesday, March 27, we will collect all Rice Bowl donations from school families at our school Mass. GOLF SIGN-UPS

Sign ups are now open for Holy Trinity golf. We will be doing HT golf a little different in 2024.

We plan to have two groups: Beginners and Experienced.

The beginners program is targeted to casual players looking to improve their game by attending clinics taught by a PGA professional. The clinics will be capped off with a 9-hole round of golf to put their lessons to use.

We have five clinics scheduled at Seneca Golf Course with PGA golf professional Kevin Greenwell. The clinics will be from 4:00 - 5:15 p.m. on 4/8, 4/15, 4/22, 4/29, and 5/6.

The experienced program is targeted to competitive golfers focused on the CSAA tournament and matches. The CSAA golf tournament is not a clinic for beginners. Each player must keep pace with the other players in their group. Prior experience playing golf on a regulation golf course is necessary. We hesitate to put a number out there but having the ability to shoot in the 40s on 9 holes is a good target.

Note: The CSAA Tournament will be played in June 3 at Seneca.
